We hope the following information will assist you in determining if you have better dates or rare coins. It's important to note that dates not mentioned in the booklet can still hold a high value, depending upon the condition.

ROOSEVELT DIMES

1946 - 1964

Weight: 2.5 grams Diameter: 17.9mm Composition: 90% Silver 10% Copper

There aren't any particularly better dates, but all Roosevelt dimes from 1946-64 have silver value. Condition isn't generally important since the value is based on the price of silver.

There are no significantly better dates in circulated grades. Their value is primarily based on the price of silver

KENNEDY HALF DOLLARS

1964 - Present

The 1964 Kennedy is 90% Silver (only year of this composition)

Kennedy Halves from 1965-1970 are **40% silver**

Ones from 1971 and later are not silver and are generally only worth face value, including the 1976 Bicentennial

Better date Morgans are heavily counterfeited, particularly 1893-1895. One common way is by removing the mint mark, so make sure there's no unusual color, scratches, or marks in the mint mark area.

1895 Morgans are Proof only, so examples MUST be authenticated by a grading service.

These coins are only worth their face value. The only exception is 40% silver Eisenhower dollars that were sold for a premium in blue envelopes, brown boxes and special proof/mint sets. They are recognizable by the lack of copper on the coin's edge.

FINAL THOUGHTS TO COINSIDER

There's a great deal of information out there, especially on the internet, about coins. To summarize, the coin market is like the car market. Many factors like date, condition and demand contribute to how much something is worth. When determining value, keep in mind that "asking prices" aren't the same as "sold prices."

If you have coins for sale, we would advise getting a second opinion or seeking help at a reputable coin shop (not a pawn shop or jewelery store). If you are interested in buying, try to avoid sources that are untrustworthy or have huge markups.

GRADING

Coins are graded on a scale from 1-70

PO Poor: 1 **F** Fine: 12 - 15

FR Fair: 2 **VF** Very Fine: 20 - 35 **AG** About Good: 3 **XF** Extra Fine: 40 - 45

G Good: 4 - 6 **AU** About Uncirculated: 50 - 58

VG Very Good: 8 - 10 MS Mint State: 60 - 70

GLOSSARY

Business Strike: A coin struck from regular, non-polished dies **Certified Coin:** A coin that has been graded/authenticated by a grading service (PCGS, NGC or ANACS)

Clad: A coin that contains no precious metals or is only plated with a precious metal

Error: Defective coin made at the mint

Fineness: The precentage of precious metal in a coin

Junk SIlver: Common date silver coins only worth their metal

Melt Value: The value of the metals the coin is made of

Mil: Term that describes the thickness of a plating

Mint Mark: Small letter or two that shows where the coin was made (see page 1 for mint mark guide)

Numismatist: Term for a professional in coin collecting

Obverse: The front of a coin (aka heads)

Proof: A coin struck from specially polished dies (certified proofs are graded as "PF/PR" instead of "MS")

Raw Coin: A coin that has not been certified by a grading service (PCGS, NGC or ANACS)

Reverse: The back of a coin (aka tails)

Spot Price: The daily price of a precious metal (most coin dealers use *kitco.com*)
